This wine list is a work in progress and hopefully will never be finished. Please also note that some of the vintages offered are rare and we might not carry large quantities. If you have the time look through the list, there are some fantastic wines from both individual family producers to large winemaking companies. They all have their place on our list and I have tasted them all. If you would like to talk about a particular wine or need some help selecting, please feel free to ask.

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WINE BY THE GLASS

METHODE CAP CLASSIQUE

NV Colmant, Brut Reserve

12% Vol

A subtle golden glow is reflected amongst a graceful dance of bubbles. The nose is delicate and elegant with its gentle spicy toastiness, a beautiful lemon and brioche perfume and the soft scent of mature stone fruits. The finish is complete and smooth, and offers a rounded tasting experience, together with the alluring caress of fine bubbles.

NV Colmant, Brut Rosé

12% Vol

A charming salmon pink colour, with a gentle glow of amber highlights, illuminating the persistent stream of bubbles. The delightful aromas of wild strawberry and redcurrant fruit infuse the scent, followed by delicate floral notes. Silky richness softens the palate with a succession of taste sensations, from red berry explosions to a subtle creamy texture.

WHITE WINE

2017 Elitte Wines, Rare Diamond White Blend

13% Vol

Lemon medium colour with medium intensity. The bouquet brings white peaches, citrus notes and lightly toasted notes to the front. Soft entry on the palate with fresh acidity and a lingering aftertaste. 90% Chardonnay and 10% Viognier.

Coastal Region

2017 Post House, Stamp of Chenin, Chenin Blanc

14% Vol

Peach, citrus with liquorice aromas that delivers a rich full bodied palate. Flavours of tropical fruits and orange zest with a soft and round mouth feel with a long finish.

Stellenbosch

2017 Vondeling, Chardonnay

13.5% Vol

The wine has a lemon and pale straw colour. It displays a refreshing nose of bright citrus, potpourri and peach blossoms with a subtle hint of beeswax. Medium bodied wine with a great palate tension. Fresh, chalky citrus, yellow flowers, candied almonds and ginger spice. The flavours are vibrant and the finish refined. The freshness of the wine makes it ideally matched for mild, aromatic curries.

2018 Beaumont, Chenin Blanc

12.5% Vol

A fresh and pure unwooded Chenin Blanc, made to express the delicious purity of the grape. A lovely wine to enjoy on its own or even better with a slightly spicy dish.

Bot River

2018 Black Elephant Vintners, Sauvignon Blanc

13% Vo

'Two Dogs, A Peacock & A Horse'. The wine is translucent with a bright green hue. The nose is opulent with aromas of passionfruit, pear, lemongrass, litchi and grapefruit. The palate is lively and concentrated with flavours of tropical fruits, gooseberry, creamy richness from the extended lees contact and lingering with fresh acidity and minerality.

2018 Simonsig, Gewürztraminer

13.5% Vol

This sunshine late-harvest wine with a golden straw colour exudes aromas of litchis and rose petals. White Turkish delight embraces the palate and makes an exit with a tantalizing lime finish. The rich and complex layers of fruit are well balanced with a fine and delicate acidity. **Stellenbosch**

ROSÉ

2016 La Residence, Rosé (Shiraz)

13% Vol

An elegant soft pink colour with a bouquet of rose petals, Turkish delight and bright red berries. This all follows through to the palate with a soft grip mouthfeel and lingering notes. **Franschhoek**

RED WINE

2013 La Residence, Shiraz

14% Vol

With a rich purple colour, this vibrant wine entices with an explosive mix of violets, black pepper. The entry is juicy and bright leading to a fresh palate that combines flavours of black cherries and dark chocolate.

2014 La Residence, Cabernet Sauvignon

14.5% Vol

Blackcurrants and violets captivate on entry, followed by concentrated dark berry flavours and spicy tobacco oak.

2014 Seven Springs, Pinot Noir

13.5% Vol

The brilliant red colour is indicative of the elegant red berry aromas, which follow through to the palate showing enticing, concentrated ripe cherry and cranberry flavours. Designed to be enjoyed immediately.

Shaw's Pass, Hermanus

2015 Neil Ellis, Cabernet Sauvignon / Merlot

14% Vol

Vibrant colour with youthful purple hues. Bright aromatic sweet fruit with spicy varietal notes. Fine, elegant, nicely framed attractive palate with cedar undertones.

2016 Bottega Family, Rosso Di Stellenbosch

13% Vol

A lively red wine with aromatic notes of raspberries, sweet cherries and Prosciutto. Delicate oaking in 2nd and 3rd fill French oak barrels contribute to both fruity and savoury notes on the palate. A fantastic drinking wine with good acidity and a smooth, elegant finish typical of Italian varietal wines.

2017 Olifantsberg, Pinotage

17 5% Val

A pure expression of lovely cherry, wild strawberry and ripe raspberry aromas supported by refined tannins. Bright and juicy.

FORTIFIED WINE

2014 Boplaas, Cape Vintage Reserve

18% Vol

An inky black wine with hints of fiery garnet on the rim, with a bouquet of crushed black berry, tart cranberry, kirsch and purple plums with bright all-spice top notes intermingled by fynbos and savoury undercurrents. The bouquet unfurls onto a bold palate with liquorice, red fruits and cacao hints to the dry finish. Time will temper the fiery fruity exuberance of youth, slowly unfurling the complexities of this fine Cape Fortifieds.

Beautiful orange sapphire in colour. Secondary aromas of orange peel, caramel, nuts and toffee which follows through with elegant aged flavours of caramel, toffee, roasted nuts and fruitcake.

WHITE WINE Bottle | Glass

2015 Keermont, Terasse

13.5% Vol R 460 I R 115

A polished light yellow gold colour, this wine has a bouquet driven by vanilla and butterscotch with undertones of peach and cut grass. Upfront fruit flavours of peach and apricot are complimented by hints of spice and green pepper as well as a touch of oak. The palate has a crunchy apple acidity which holds the wine together into a long succulent dry finish.

Blaauwklippen Valley, Stellenbosch

2016 Boekenhoutskloof, Semillon

13.5 Vol R 795 I R 200

Freshly squeezed citrus, pear, orange blossom, lemon curd and honeysuckle. The bright yellow fruit follows through onto a vibrant yet elegant palate with a richly textured mineral core, a firm structure and soft, balanced acidity. The wine has a long, dry, nutty, spicy finish with peach blossoms and hints of marzipan lingering in the mouth.

2016 Delaire Graff, Chenin Bl. Reserve

4% Vol R 510 I R 130

Light golden wheat colour. Layered expressions of citrus and tropical fruit with subtle layers of honey and almonds in the background. Balanced and superbly structured, the flavours are complimented by a delicate minerality.

2016 Rupert & Rothschild, Chardonnay

13% Vol R 705 I R 175

Crisp, lemon notes with subtle grapefruit nuances with smooth, creamy nougat flavours followed by macadamia nut undertones.

2017 Ataraxia, Sauvignon Blanc

13.5% Vol R 355 I R 90

This wine favours individuality and minerality ahead of pure, pungent fruit, but still shows hints of passion fruit and citrus as well as green melon aromas. These are effortlessly reflected on the palate and are complemented by a lively acidity which underpins a classy structure and succulent texture. A wine of substantial poise, length and charm.

2012 Anthonij Rupert, Merlot

14.5% Vol R 1 470 I R 370

Spicy cedar and blackberry aromas mingle with a bold cocoa and plum on the nose. So soft and rounded - almost velvety in the mouth with those fruit and oak spice aromas making their way to the palate confidently. They're joined by tobacco leaf, cigar box and more dark chocolate flavour. Complex and layered too. A wine that remains a memory long after the mouthful has gone.

2014 Stony Brook, Cabernet Sauvignon

14% Vol R 1 010 I R 255

There is a classic, lead pencil, cigar-box aroma that is immediately evident on the nose, followed by ripe, dark cherry and blackberry fruit. The rich oak component follows from the nose to the palate, where there is a lovely balance between acidity and firm tannins. The finish is long, clean and savoury, asking to be paired with a succulent meat dish.

2015 Chamonix, Cabernet Franc

14.5% Vol R 495 I R 125

A deep ruby mulberry colour and intense bouquet with scents reminiscent of bell pepper, red berries, spice and cigar box. A wine of ample structure fills the mouth with concentrated fruit and berry sensations.

2015 Simonsig, Red Hill, Pinotage

14% Vol R 935 I R 235

A full-bodied, wood-matured wine from a dedicated vineyard site that counts among the most awarded Pinotages in South Africa. The dense opaque colour holds rich flavours of black fruit and sweet plum, with a lavish mouthfeel encrusted with cedar oak spice. Smooth tannins sculpt a lingering palate of fruit-filled pockets.

2017 Hamilton Russell Vineyards, Pinot Noir

Their philosophy of expressing terroir in their wines give rise to a certain tightness, tannin line and elevated length to balance the richness and generosity of this Pinot noir. 2006 Dom Perignon

Dom Pérignon is only vintage. Only the best grapes of a single year are chosen. Each vintage is unique and reinterprets the uniqueness of the seasons. Dom Pérignon dares not to declare a vintage if the result is not exceptional. After more than eight years of cellaring, the wine reflects the perfect balance of Dom Pérignon.

2006 Louis Roederer, Cristal

Produced uniquely during the best years, when the Chardonnay and Pinot noir grapes have attained perfect maturity. Cristal is aged for 6 years in Louis Roederer's cellars and left for a further 8 months after dégorgement. This concentrated, dense, ripe, fresh and long Cristal 2006 is unhesitatingly made using full-bodied, smooth Pinots and fresh, elegant mineral Chardonnays.

Light yellow-gold. Focused, expressive nose delivering lovely raspberry and citrus notes. The palate shows alluringly fine, closely-integrated texture and bubbles, freshness and persistency. An ethereal, precise dry Champagne. $A\ddot{\mathbf{v}}$

NV Laurent-Perrier

This fresh and pure wine is perfect for an apéritif. Its citrus and white fruits notes and its remarkable balance supported by a subtle effervescence, make it an ideal accompaniment to poultry and the finest fish.

A very clear colour, fine and crystalline. The scent of spring, intense and complex. It makes play with an aromatic array of stone fruit and honeysuckle with an underlying lively dash of citrus.

The taste is perfectly rounded, incisive and elegant. Its fruit, floral and mineral notes guarantee a lengthy concert of taste sensations. The overriding sensation is one of purity without austerity.

Deep gold colour with very fine, elegant bubbles. A very expressive and complex cuvée revealing fine aromas of hazelnut, vanilla and brioche. Mineral and chalky on entry to the palate with a fat, well-balanced structure, revealing pastry and candied fruit aromas with a soft smooth mousse.

Veuve Clicquot manages to reconcile two opposing factors - strength and silkiness - and to hold them in perfect balance with aromatic intensity and a lot of freshness. This consistent power to please makes it ideal as an aperitif and perfect as the Champagne to enjoy with a meal.

CHAMPAGNE BRUT ROSÉ

NV Billecart-Salmon

R 3 825

Its pale and bright pink colour is adorned with warm glints of gold and its delicate slowly rising bubbles give it a persistent mousse. This cuvée unveils a subtle aroma leading to an elegant, delicate bouquet of fine notes of red fruits and zest of citrus fruits. Its special method of vinification gives this cuvée a light, elegant flavour, followed by a fresh finish with a taste of raspberry. This rosé champagne is an ideal partner as an aperitif and can also accompany a dish of wild salmon or sushi. For dessert, it will add a sublime touch to red fruit flavours.

Elegant, with colour changing naturally from a pretty raspberry hue to salmon-pink. A precise nose of extraordinary freshness and a wide range of red fruits: raspberry, redcurrant, strawberry, black cherry. On the palate, it offers the sensation of plunging into a basket of freshly picked red berries.





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BREEDEKLOOF

The Breedekloof district is characterised by vineyards which flourish on alluvial valley soils with adequate drainage as they rest on a bed of river stones. It covers a large proportion of the Breede River Valley and its tributaries. There are marked variations between the soils and mesoclimates in the different river valleys. This district incorporates the Goudini and Slanghoek wards. There are some 24 wineries on the Breedekloof Wine Route.



BOT RIVER

The Bot River ward is the gateway to Walker Bay and encompasses the Bot River village and valley, stretching from the Bot River lagoon up into the foothills of the Groenlandberg and Babylonstoren mountain ranges, and bordering the Kogelberg Biosphere. The area is renowned for its cool maritime microclimate, which is influenced by its proximity to the lagoon and Walker Bay – cooling afternoon winds blow up the valley off the sea. Soils are mainly homogenous Bokkeveld shale (predominantly Glen Rosa and Klapmuts) and Table Mountain sandstone. Chenin Blanc, Sauvignon Blanc, Pinotage, Shiraz and other Rhône varietals fare particularly well here. Bot River is home to an eclectic mix of handcrafted wineries and its rustic charm lies in its quirky character.

OVERBERG

Newer viticultural areas have opened up in the southerly Overberg district, with award-winning wines emerging from the Klein River ward near Stanford.

WALKER BAY

This district, surrounding the seaside town of Hermanus, is reputed for the Chardonnay and Pinot Noir wines which emanate from the Hemel-en-Aarde Valley – this encompasses the wards of Hemel-en-Aarde Ridge, Hemel-en-Aarde Valley, Sunday's Glen and Upper Hemel-en-Aarde Valley. The area is also being noticed for the outstanding and consistent quality of its Pinotage. Fine examples of Sauvignon Blanc, Merlot and Shiraz are also being produced here. The cool climate is the sought-after attribute in this area where vineyards benefit from persistent cooling winds from the nearby ocean. The soils – predominantly weathered shales – and terroir are also ideal for cool-climate loving varieties. Further to the east lies the Stanford Foothills ward.

METHODE CAP CLASSIQUE

2014 Creation, Elation, M.C.C.

The maiden Elation M.C.C. is an exquisitely crafted blend of Chardonnay and Pinot Noir. Classified 'Brut Nature', the wine contains only natural residual sugar and is delightfully crisp with a generous dash of exuberance and an elegant touch of finesse with the gentlest aromas of lemon blossom and dried apple followed by wild strawberry and hints of fresh brioche.

These are echoed on the oh-so-clean and pure palate where buttery nuances are beautifully balanced by the characteristic Creation minerality as a hallmark of freshness and finesse.

2016 Crystallum, The Agnes, Chardonnay 13.5% Vol R 9

A complex nose bursts forward with layered notes of ripe apple, pear and granadilla. The delightful fruity character of the wine is underpinned by a vibrantly zesty undercurrent of lime with nuanced notes of honey. The Agnes Chardonnay is a lovely example of an elegantly balanced cooler-region Chardonnay.

2016 Reyneke, Natural Chenin Blanc

12.5% Vol

R 2 145

Unfined and unfiltered, the first vintage of this intense, deeply coloured Chenin from a 50 year old block is a thing of wonder. There are only three barrels, alas, but it's one of the great interpretations of the grape. Yeasty, savoury and complex with notes of honey, wet stone and Tarte Tatin and a finish that lingers.

2017 Ataraxia, Sauvignon Blanc

Named after their grandmother, Hope Marguerite Beaumont. Only native yeast, this barrel fermented and matured Chenin Blanc is always elegant and complex. No Malo lactic fermentation was done to preserve the natural acidity and freshness of the wine. It spent 10 months on its gross lees and then bottled. It is seen as one of South Africa's benchmark Chenin wines.

2017 Creation, Chardonnay

R 600

The beautifully fresh Creation Chardonnay is slightly more fruit-driven than the other with generous quince, pear and peach aromas and flavours, enhanced by fresh minerality and hints of vanilla. Well-judged acidity contributes excellent balance and a lively, lingering aftertaste.

2017 Hamilton Russell Vineyards, Chardonnay 13% Vol

R 1 340

A tight, minerally wine with classic Hamilton Russell Vineyards length and complexity. Unusually prominent pear and lime fruit aromas and flavours are brought beautifully into focus by a tight line of bright natural acid and a long, dry minerality. An elegant, yet textured and intense wine with a strong personality of both place and vintage.

2013 Luddite, Shiraz

Dark purply red showing fantastic vibrancy and colour to the edge of the glass. Perfumed, floral, hints of violet, typical Luddite cloves and dark fruit. Elegant balanced entry. Gentle spice, plums, dark cherries with a long elegant finish, balanced tannins and a hint of wood. Rather yummy and decadent.

A confident wine with a firm and polished profile of flavours without being overstated. It is classically old world with good aging potential. Peppery spice with blackberry and cherry notes, ending in a harmonious and long earthy finish.

2016 Creation, The Art of Pinot Noir

Shiny, deep pomegranate-seed red with a robust bouquet of rose petal, dark cherry, pimento and anise. Complex and utterly enchanting on the palate: opulent layers of cherry and plum mingling with earthy flavours of mushroom and an elegant sprinkling of spice.

The 2016 Cuvée Cinema Pinot Noir is produced from fruit grown from a single vineyard. Aromas of sour cherry, musk, forest floor and flint lead into a palate that is intense and concentrated with a fine, but firm tannin base.






CAPE AGULHAS

Most of these maritime vineyards are situated in the ward of Elim near Africa's southernmost point, Cape Agulhas. The entire picturesque village of Elim, a Moravian mission settlement founded in 1824, is a national monument. Strong, cooling winds are prevalent in summer, ensuring a very cool ripening season, perfect for Sauvignon Blanc and also promising for Semillon and Shiraz. Generating much interest in the winelands, the still small hectarage of this coastal district shows great potential.

CAPE TOWN

A recently designated district named after Cape Town, one of the world's foremost tourism brands, incorporates the wards of Constantia, Hout Bay, Durbanville and Philadelphia. At its furthest point, the district is 36km from the Cape Town CBD.

On the southern slopes of the Table Mountain range and its world-renowned floral kingdom lies the historic Constantia valley, the cradle of winemaking in the Cape. The valley, which falls within the Cape Peninsula disrict, was the site of Simon van der Stel's 17th-century wine farm and the origin of the Constantia dessert wines which became famous throughout Europe during the 18th century. Rooted in ancient soils, the vineyards climb up the east-facing slopes of the Constantiaberg, where the vines benefit from the cool sea breezes blowing in from False Bay. The ward receives about 1 000mm of rain annually, making irrigation unnecessary, and has a mean February temperature of 20.6°C. There are only a handful of cellars in this premier ward, where the cool climate favours the production of white wines, notably Sauvignon Blanc, and where the tradition of producing remarkable wines since 1685 continues.

The acclaimed Cape Point vineyards, some of them a mere 1.2km from the sea, are situated on the western edges of the Cape Peninsula. This cool-climate maritime pocket in the district of Cape Town is recognised mainly for its Sauvignon Blanc and Semillon.

The vineyards of Durbanville, like those of Constantia, lie very close to Cape Town and border on the northern suburbs. Several estates and wineries, situated mainly on the rolling hill slopes with their various aspects and altitudes, continue to make a wide variety of wine styles. Some of the vineyards grow at altitudes as high as 38om above sea level. Wines from this ward attracting attention are Sauvignon Blanc, Chardonnay, Merlot and Cabernet Sauvignon. Deep soils, cooling sea breezes, night-time mists and close proximity to the ocean are beneficial factors when it comes to the quality of the grapes. A newer ward north of Durbanville, Philadelphia also benefits from cooling Atlantic influences. The hilly terrain of this area means some of the vineyards are higher than usual, up to 26om above sea level. This facilitates a significant difference in day-night temperature and results in slower ripening. Some highly regarded Cabernet Sauvignons, Merlots and red blends have already emerged from this promising appellation.

Deep, dark cherry red in colour indicates excellent extraction. The nose is packed with sweet black cherry, dried cranberry aromas and plum, underscored by nuances of marmite with hints of game. A sweet, tart entry develops into pleasing mulberry fruit, supported by liquorice and mocha with a rich mouthfeel. A highly extracted wine, packed with sweet red berry fruit, which with time will soften into a silky, juicy, complex Merlot.

VIN DE CONSTANCE BY THE GLASS



"The sweet, luscious and excellent dessert wine called Constantia" soon became part of the literature of the 19th century. In Edwin Drood, Charles Dickens tells of "...the support embodied in a glass of Constantia and a home-made biscuit", while Jane Austen recommends that her forsaken heroine try a little Constantia for "...its healing powers on a disappointed heart". A German poet, Klopstock, devoted an entire ode to the pleasures of this sweet wine, while Baudelaire transformed it into a sensuous image for his great brooding poem "Les Fleurs du Mal".

Now, over a century after its disappearance, comes the renaissance – Vin de Constance – made in the style of the old Constantia, from vineyards which once produced this legendary wine.

Unctuously sweet, deeply complex and concentrated tropical and Seville orange marmalade flavours are lifted by a fine acid thread to a satisfyingly long, delicious and "lipsmackingly" vibrant finish.

The bold, sweet palate is perfectly balanced by tight acidity which results in a long-lingering honeyed finish.

2009 Klein Constantia, Vin De Constance 14% Vol R 5500 I R 610 Golden orange in colour, with delicate aromas of nougat and honeycomb. The palate has a fresh acidity with rich flavours of Seville marmalade and dried apricots enveloping the mouth. These fruity notes are married with sandal wood and all spice flavours. Richly aromatic that tapers into an elegant and endless finish.

2011 Klein Constantia, Vin De Constance 13.27% Vol R 4100 I R 460 Wonderfully bright on both the nose and palate. Concentrated flavours of apricot and orange zest with aspects of frangipani flowers abound. Mouth filling yet clean and focused, the wine tapers into a rich luscious finish.



Some exciting wines are emanating from this ward in the Cederberg mountain range, which is best known for its Sauvignon and Shiraz, as well as its Chardonnay, Chenin and Cabernet.



Now award-winning wine showing exceptional fruit and elegance are produced here, with Chardonnay, Riesling, Sauvignon Blanc, Pinot Noir and Shiraz doing particularly well in this later-ripening, cooler terroir.



FRANSCHHOEK

The district of Franschhoek has retained its distinct French Huguenot character. Regarded as the 'culinary capital' of the Cape, Franschhoek is a member of The Délice Network of Good Food Cities of the World. The Franschhoek valley lies to the southeast of Paarl and is enclosed on three sides by towering mountains: the Groot Drakenstein and Franschhoek mountains which meet at the top of the valley and the Klein Drakenstein and Simonsberg mountains, found further down towards Paarl. Streams from the higher peaks flow down to the valley floor where they converge to form the Berg River, fast-flowing in winter when snow caps the peaks and a mere stream in summer, fed by the Wemmershoek Dam.



PAARL

The Paarl wine district lies to the north of Stellenbosch, and is bordered by the town of Wellington to the north-east, and the mountains of the Groot and Klein Drakenstein and Franschhoek ranges to the south-east. The Berg River, flanked by the majestic Groot Drakenstein and Wemmershoek mountains, runs through Paarl and is the life-giving artery of this wine-producing area. The valley land requires supplementary irrigation in the hot growing season before the harvest, but vineyards on the eastern slopes, having better water retention, frequently need none at all. A large variety of grapes are grown in Paarl, of which Cabernet Sauvignon, Pinotage, Shiraz, Chardonnay and Chenin Blanc have the best potential. The Paarl district includes the wards of Simonsberg-Paarl, on the prime foothills of the Simonsberg, Agter-Paarl and Voor Paardeberg.

WELLINGTON

Some of the wineries in this burgeoning district, which is a mere 45-minutes from Cape Town, stretch over alluvial terraces towards the Swartland's rolling hills and wheat fields, while others are found in the foothills of the towering Hawequa mountains, where folds and valleys create unique mesoclimates. Wellington, which supplies over 85% of the South African wine industry with cuttings, also boasts some 26 wine producers ranging from historical estates to boutique wineries. In winter, snow sometimes covers the mountain tops and night temperatures are generally cooler than at the coast some 60km away. The district comprises of five wards: Blouvlei, Bovlei, Groenberg, Limietberg and Mid-Berg River.

The wine is tangy and vibrant, while taut and focused.



ROBERTSON

Dubbed the 'valley of vines and roses', the Robertson district's lime-rich soils make the area eminently suitable for racehorse stud farming and also, of course, winegrowing. Situated in the Breede River valley, the river is the lifeblood of this lower rainfall region. Although summer temperatures can be high, cooling south-easterly winds channel moisture-laden air into the valley.

Robertson is renowned for the quality of its wines and while traditionally considered white wine territory and known mainly for its Chardonnays and more recently for the quality of its Sauvignon Blanc, it is also the source of some of the Cape's finest red wines, particularly Shiraz and Cabernet Sauvignon, while the distinctive fortified dessert wines for which it was originally famed continue to be produced. The district of Robertson incorporates several wards, including Bonnievale.



STELLENBOSCH

The historical town of Stellenbosch, which features some of the finest examples of Cape Dutch architecture, boasts a winemaking tradition which stretches back to the end of the 17th-century. The mountainous terrain, good rainfall, deep, well-drained soils and diversity of terroirs make this a sought-after viticultural area. The rapidly increasing number of wine estates and producers (more than 200) includes some of the most famous names in Cape wine. The district, with its mix of historic estates and contemporary wineries, produces excellent examples of almost all the noble grape varieties and is known for the quality of its blended reds.

Stellenbosch, the 'town of oaks', is also the educational and research centre of the winelands. Stellenbosch University is the only university in South Africa which offers a degree in viticulture and oenology, and it has many of the country's most successful winemakers as alumni. The Elsenburg School of Agriculture is also near Stellenbosch, as is the Nietvoorbij Institute of Viticulture and Oenology. This organisation has one of the most modern experimental wineries in the world and, at its experimental farms (situated in several winegrowing districts), important research into new varietals, clones and rootstocks is undertaken.

The intensively farmed Stellenbosch district has been divided up into several smaller viticultural pockets including Banghoek, Bottelary, Devon Valley, Jonkershoek Valley, Papegaaiberg, Polkadraai Hills and Simonsberg-Stellenbosch.



SWARTLAND

Traditionally a grain-producing area, in summer the Swartland district is marked by green pockets of vineyards clambering up the foothills of the mountains (Piketberg, Porterville, Riebeek and Perdeberg) and along the banks of the Berg River. In the past, the region was planted mainly to bushvines but trellising is increasingly being adopted due to advances in management strategies and quality considerations.

The Swartland literally translated means 'the black land' and the area takes its name from the now endangered indigenous renosterbos (rhino bush) which once turned the landscape a dark colour at certain times of the year. The district was traditionally a source of robust, full-bodied red wines and high quality, fortified wines. The Swartland Independent Producers (SIP) is a coming together of a group of like-minded producers working to express a true sense of place in the wines of the Swartland. In recent times, some exciting award-winning wines have emerged, both red and white, and the area continues to produce top port-style wines. Increasing percentages of Pinotage, Shiraz and Cabernet Sauvignon are being grown here, as well as Chardonnay, Chenin Blanc and Sauvignon Blanc. It has four designated wards, Malmesbury, Riebeekberg, Riebeeksrivier and St Helena Bay. The district of Swartland borders Piketberg to the north, which is not dissimilar in both geography and climate.
