

SELINDA RESERVE | NORTHERN BOTSWANA

The Dhow Suite at Zarafa is an exquisite two-bedroom tented suite located on the private 130,000-hectare Selinda Reserve in northern Botswana, an area linking the Okavango Delta and the Chobe/Savute corridors.

Few properties rival the location of this little gem built entirely under canvas, as one of the largest suites ever built on the continent. The Dhow Suite is located adjacent to Zarafa Camp which, together with Duba Plains and Selinda Camps, is one of only three Relais & Châteaux properties in Botswana. Overlooking the crystal waters of Zibadianja Lagoon, the source of the famous Savute Channel, every area of the suite has a magnificent view. The lagoon is also the water source for a tremendous population of wildlife – dry season sightings boast buffalo and elephant by the hundreds.

Zarafa Camp is the brainchild of the founders of Great Plains Conservation, who pooled their collective experience on safari to create what they deemed to be the best and most environmentally innovative camp. Zarafa means "the beloved one" or "the lovely one" in Arabic. The name comes from a giraffe, which was presented to Charles X of France in 1826 by the Viceroy of Egypt. She travelled from Africa in a traditional Dhow boat, and it was on this journey that she was given her name reflecting her true elegance and splendor.

The suite, 210 square metre (2,260 sq ft) in extent, is under beige, flowing canvas, with canopy ceilings and completely open (yet netted) sides. Entering through the heavy wood Lamu door transports guests to a lavish space of deep reds, browns, brass and copper, evoking richness and beauty.

The Dhow Suite at Zarafa successfully retains a clearly African feel, while balancing that delicate relationship between personal and informal and romance and adventure. There is no equal in terms of its environmental credentials and its careful appointments.

Selinda Reserve, at the crossroads of some of northern Botswana's most prolific wildlife areas, boasts staggering wildlife populations year-round. Home to some of the classic species, such as leopard, lion, elephant, buffalo, Red lechwe, zebra and giraffe, it is also a refuge for some of the more uncommon species such as African wild dog (which usually den each dry season near camp), cheetah, roan and sable. And for birders, it will not disappoint. Our nearby African skimmer colony is a highlight, as are the antics of the Black egret on the shores of Zibadianja Lagoon.





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From the Dhow Suite, hippos are visible in the Lagoon and elephant wander through regularly. Night noises will either lull you to sleep or wake you from a deep slumber. It is an exciting area, and guests are in the heart of a wilderness wonderland.

- Light aircraft transfers from Kasane (55 mins) and Maun (45 min) airports;
- Private Air charter access available;
- The Dhow Suite at Zarafa is a 45-minute drive from its airstrip;

ACTIVITIES

The Dhow Suite at Zarafa offer complete flexibility with your own private guide and vehicle.

Game drives

Drives do focus on the most comfortable and productive times of day, early morning and late afternoon into the early evening returning to camp after sunset. Full day drives are also quite common at a guest's request. Picnic brunch can be delivered, and the vehicles are stocked with cold drinks.

Guided walks

Guided walks can also be arranged and are led by licensed guides with firearm training.

Photography

- There is a custom-built Land Cruiser specially designed for our conditions and photography (folddown screens and raised roofs) with four individual bucket seats;
- The Suite has a professional camera set, including two camera bodies with two 100-400mm lenses and one wide angle lens. Photos will be downloaded to a storage device on guest's departure. Each room also comes with a pair of high-quality binoculars for guest use as well.



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Boating

- Zarafa offers guests a unique pontoon experience. The pontoon is known as H.E.S. Zib. The pontoon provides a 275 sq. foot deck complete with couches, a dining area and a bar where guests can comfortably enjoy floating brunch or sundowners while watching hippos and elephants in the water.
- It is also an exceptional platform for birding;
- There is also a flat-bottomed aluminium power boat to explore the lagoon and channels around the area.

Fishing

Fly-fishing and rod/reel kit is available between March and December for those who want to try their cast at the local bream on a catch and release basis

Private vehicle option

Available as standard.

Private Guides

Private guides are encouraged and welcomed.

Scenic Flight and Champagne Stop

Enjoy an aerial viewing experience with great scenery across the Linyanti/Savuti and Selinda Spillway. Add a 15-minute champagne stop on palm island en route. Must be booked in advance and is subject to extra cost and availability.

FOOD AND BEVERAGE

- Our world-class meals are Relais & Châteaux recognised;
- All meals included and prepared by our Executive Chefs and their teams:
- All drinks and beverages are included, including imported spirits and champagnes;
- A la carte dining in the privacy of the Dhow Suite at Zarafa;
- Indoor and outdoor dining locations;
- All dietary requirements are catered for from regular to vegan to children; prior notice required;
- We are extremely flexible on timings. Picnic breakfasts or lunch (or both) are the norm due to very active game drives, often delivered to the bush!

ACCOMMODATION DETAILS

Bedroom features

- Two large bedrooms are connected to either side of the main area;
- 2,260 sq. foot Marquee style tent of canopied beige canvas on raised wood deck of 100-year- old teak railroad ties;
- Mosquito netting on all tented suite sides and over beds;
- Standing fan, and over bed air-conditioner;
- Gas fireplace for winter;
- Either twin or double bed configuration.

Bathroom features

- Each room in the suite features an en-suite open-air concept bathroom with indoor shower, claw foot deep copper tub and double vanities;
- Outdoor shower;
- Hot and cold running water;
- Separate flush loo room;
- Soap, shampoo, conditioner and lotion and hairdryers provided.

ACCOMMODATING CHILDREN AND SHARING ACCOMMODATION

- Children are accommodated from a minimum age of 6 years;
- The Dhow Suite at Zarafa can cater for a maximum of four adults sharing or two adults and up to three children (aged 6 15), sharing in two separate bedrooms;
- Child rates and private vehicle requirements do not apply because camp is sold on exclusive use basis only;
- Walking is possible from 6 years if guests are in the Dhow Suite at Zarafa where private vehicle and guide is automatically included in the nightly rate;
- Young children must be supervised as the camp is open with high predator densities in and around camp and there is water surrounding camp. The camp also features raised decks and a pool which is not covered;
- Great Plains Young Explorers program thoughtfully designed to explore a range of experiences and topics from birding to cooking to art to tracking wildlife.











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SPA

Guests staying in the Dhow Suite at Zarafa can make use of The Spa at Zarafa, located between suite 4 and the Dhow Suite. The Spa offers guests two treatment areas and with a range of treatments available. All ingredients used in your spa treatments were personally chosen by Dereck and Beverly Joubert in conjunction with Spacology. Spa treatments are at an additional cost.

FITNESS

The following exercise equipment is available for guests to enjoy in the privacy of their suite or on the private deck overlooking the lagoon:

The Dhow Suite at Zarafa guest's also have access to the gym area at Zarafa where the following equipment is available:

POWER AND COMMUNICATION

Power

- The camp is run by an impressive solar farm of 170 panels with generator back-up;
- This system produces 220V, 24-hour electricity to the suite and main area:
- Universal plug points in the suite.

Internet & Mobile

- Wi-fi available in suite;
- No mobile signal.

HEALTH AND SAFETY Health

- Malaria: Minimal exposure risk
 – Malaria prophylaxis are recommended if guests are concerned; however, this is a remote area with little occurrence;
- Guests must hold comprehensive medical insurance and emergency evacuation insurance;
- Senior staff all has first aid training;
- Nearest decent medical facility is in Maun, and then Johannesburg.

Possibility of Disabled access

The Dhow Suite at Zarafa layout is not conducive to wheelchair-bound guests due stair access and steps on the main deck.



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Safety

- This remotely located camp is unfenced to wild animals that do move through the property especially at night;
- Four fire extinguishers.

- Staff gratuities can be paid by credit card or in Botswana Pula, South African Rands, US Dollars (2004 bills or later only) or GB Pounds;


FOUNDATION INITIATIVE Great Plains Earth Academy

Conservation is only successful when communities living alongside wildlife and protected areas are afforded opportunities to learn, interact, and benefit from these conserved areas.


